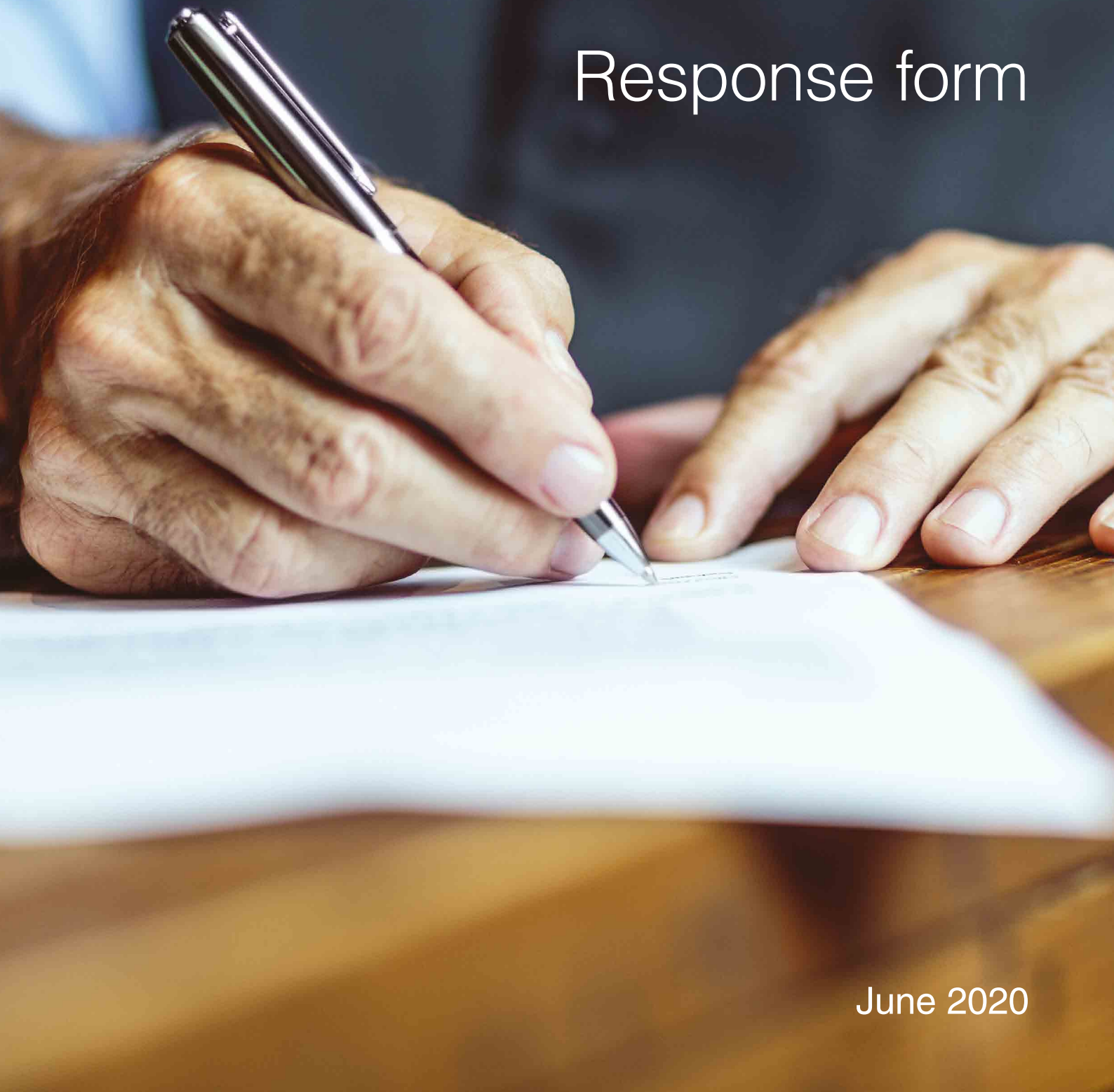


A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet improvements

Supplementary consultation

Introduction

We are consulting on proposals to upgrade the route between the Black Cat roundabout and Caxton Gibbet roundabout. The scheme will improve journeys between Milton Keynes and Cambridge, bringing communities together and supporting long term sustainable growth in the region.

Why we are consulting

In summer 2019, we consulted on the proposed design for the new dual carriageway and junction improvements. We also sought feedback on our proposals to improve safety for walkers, cyclists and horse riders and our plans to manage the environmental effects of the scheme.

We have taken your comments into consideration and have continued discussions on the scheme with affected and interested parties. As a result, and through further design development and environmental assessment, we're proposing a series of changes to the scheme.

We are now consulting on the main changes. These changes are a combination of refinements to the design, methods of construction and changes to the use and extent of the land we need to build, maintain and operate the road.

Your views will help inform the development of the scheme design submitted for development consent.



How to find out more about our proposals

This response form is designed to be read alongside the consultation booklet and four map books which will help you provide feedback on the proposed changes.

In the consultation booklet, we share the main changes, why we have made them and any impacts they may have on people or the environment.

The map books include a series of plans which also show the more minor changes we are proposing where we consider there will be no new or different effects on the environment, local communities or road users. These are:

- Map book 1 – Updated General Arrangements (including location of proposed design changes)
- Map book 2 – Updated land use plans (showing updated position of how land is intended to be used for the construction and operation of the scheme)
- Map book 3 – Changes to the development boundary (known as the Order limits) plans
- Map book 4 – Changes to the permanent land acquisition plans

We have also produced a simple guide to the maps that explains the different plans.

Data protection and you

On 25 May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) came into force. This legislation requires Highways England to explain to consultees, stakeholders and customers how their personal data will be used and stored. Highways England adheres to the Government's Consultation Principles, the Planning Act 2008 and the Highways Act 1980 as required, and may collect personal data to help shape development of highways schemes.

Personal data collected for the A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet improvements scheme will be processed and retained by Highways England and its appointed contractors until the scheme is complete.

Under the GDPR regulations you have the right to request the following information from us:

1. Right of access to the data (Subject Access Request)
2. Right for the rectification of errors
3. Right to erasure of personal data – this is not an absolute right under the legislation
4. Right to restrict processing or to object to processing
5. Right to data portability

If, at any point, Highways England plans to process the personal data we hold for a purpose other than that for which it was originally collected, we will provide you with information about what that other purpose is. This will be done prior to any further processing taking place. The extra information will include any relevant further information as referred to above, including the right to object to that further processing.

You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, the Information Commissioners Office.
