

Notice of Consultation A1 in Northumberland: Morpeth to Felton Scheme Section 47 Planning Act 2008 Notice Publicising a Statement of Community Consultation

Highways England is planning to improve the A1 between Morpeth and Felton in Northumberland. The main proposals in summary include:

- Dualling the existing A1 between Warreners Bridge and Priests Bridge at the southern end of the scheme:
- Construction of a new dual carriageway, bypassing west of the existing A1, between Priests Bridge and Burgham Park; and
- Dualling the existing A1 between Burgham Park and Felton at the northern end of the scheme:
- Construction of a new bridge to carry the A1 over the River Coquet parallel to the existing road bridge;
- 3 new split level junctions, which include a bridge over the A1, will be constructed at Highlaws, Fenrother and West Moor;
- Construction of a new bridge over the A1 at Causey Park and construction of a new road under the A1 at Burgham Park; and
- The existing A1 between Priests Bridge and Burgham Park bypassed by the new dual carriageway will become part of the local road network owned and maintained by Northumberland County Council.

We intend to make an application to the Planning Inspectorate under section 37 of The Planning Act 2008 for a development consent order to authorise construction of the scheme.

Before making our application we must produce a document called the Statement of Community Consultation setting out how we will consult the local community about our proposals. We also must make this statement available for inspection by the public and publish this notice stating where and when the statement can be inspected. We then must carry out consultation in accordance with the statement.
