

# A1 in Northumberland: Morpeth to Felton Scheme Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC)

#### Introduction

Highways England is publishing this **Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC)** in connection with a proposed improvement to the A1 between Morpeth and Felton in Northumberland. The purpose of this document is to set out how we will consult the local community about our proposal. The document also provides background to the project and how the application to build it will progress.

#### The application

Highways England is developing this scheme under the Planning Act 2008 and is publishing this statement under Section 47 of that Act. We have consulted with Northumberland County Council, the local authority responsible for the area where the scheme will be built, about plans to consult the local community.

The Planning Act 2008 requires Highways England to make an application to the Secretary of State (SoS) through the Planning Inspectorate for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to build the scheme. The SoS's role is to consider whether authorisation should be given for major infrastructure projects like this scheme.

Highways England anticipates that a DCO application for the scheme will be published early 2019. The Planning Inspectorate will examine the DCO application and the SoS will decide on whether the scheme should go ahead.

Government policy relating to the development of the national road network is set out in the National Networks National Policy Statement (NNNPS). This provides the framework for DCO applications to be considered against.

When Highways England submits its DCO application, the SoS must consider whether our consultation has been adequate. This pre-application consultation will be important in relation to the examination process that follows after an application is accepted by the Planning Inspectorate. Therefore, the best time to provide feedback on this scheme is now, by taking part in this pre-application consultation.

#### The scheme

The A1 in Northumberland: Morpeth to Felton scheme will upgrade the A1 to dual carriageway. A summary of the main features of the proposals are:

- Dualling the existing A1 between Warreners Bridge and Priests Bridge at the southern end of the scheme;
- Construction of a new dual carriageway, bypassing west of the existing A1, between Priests Bridge and Burgham Park; and
- Dualling the existing A1 between Burgham Park and Felton at the northern end of the scheme;
- Construction of a new bridge to carry the A1 over the River Coquet parallel to the existing road bridge;
- 3 new split level junctions that include a bridge over the A1 will be constructed at Highlaws, Fenrother and West Moor;
- Construction of a new bridge over the A1 at Causey Park and construction of a new road under the A1 at Burgham Park; and
- The existing A1 between Priests Bridge and Burgham Park bypassed by the new dual carriageway will become part of the local road network owned and maintained by Northumberland County Council.

The objectives of the scheme are:

- to reduce traffic congestion
- to improve road safety for road users and the local community
- to maintain east to west connectivity

#### Consulting the community

In accordance with section 47 of the Planning Act 2008, Highways England is consulting people living in the vicinity of the proposed scheme.

We have already carried out a public consultation during November and December 2016. During this we asked consultees for their views on the proposed scheme and to select their preferred route option for improvements between Morpeth and Felton. We want to make sure that the local community, the residents, local interest groups, businesses, visitors and road users, have the opportunity to fully understand the scheme and comment on our proposals. To do this we are holding a six weeks public consultation between Monday 18 June 2018 and Sunday 29 July 2018 during which, we will provide consultation information on various issues including:

- Proposals for the new and existing A1, and junction layouts of the scheme;
- Works to the existing road and side roads;
- Environmental assessments and potential environmental impacts; and

### Environmental mitigation measures

The scheme is an Environmental Impact Assessment development as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. We will therefore carry out an Environmental Impact Assessment for the scheme which will be submitted alongside the application. We are publishing Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) as part of the consultation material. This gives information about the potential environmental effects of the scheme and the measures proposed to reduce those effects, so to assist informed responses to this consultation.

Public consultation brochure	A public consultation brochure and details of the planned public consultation events will be delivered to homes and businesses in the consultation zone shown at Appendix 1 (approximately 2,000 properties). Copies will also be available at locations locally for people to collect (details of locations are set out in the table below).
Council and community / area forum briefings	We will offer briefings to local parish councils and community / area forums within the area of the proposed scheme, to discuss the proposals during the formal consultation period.
Stakeholder briefings	When invited and where it is possible to do so, we will attend meetings of local community groups affected by the proposal.
Establishing stakeholder groups	A stakeholder reference group has been established for the scheme and the fourth meeting will be held in June 2018. If a similar stakeholder group is already in existence or established by the relevant Local Authorities, we will participate when invited.

Adverts will be placed in local newspapers at the launch of the consultation and reminders will be placed ahead of the consultation
	events. Press releases detailing the consultation and how people can participate will be issued.

Comments made during the consultation will be recorded and carefully considered by Highways England and will be taken into account in developing the scheme proposal. An explanation of how the comments received have shaped and influenced our proposals will be reported in a Consultation Report prepared by Highways England which will accompany the DCO application as required by Section 37(3) (c) of the

Planning Act 2008. The Planning Inspectorate will decide whether the application meets the required standards to proceed to examination, and will determine whether Highways England's pre-application consultation has been adequate.


