

A47 Wansford to Sutton Response form



Highways England is consulting on its proposal to improve the Wansford to Sutton section of the A47 corridor.

The scheme is part of the government's strategy to improve the strategic road network in the East of England. The A47 Wansford to Sutton scheme is a critical part of this investment and will improve journeys along the A47 and between the A47 and A1, which is great news for the local and regional economy.

Why we are consulting

The purpose of this consultation is to seek your views on the proposal. Your feedback will inform our continuing development of the scheme to the point when we are ready to submit our Development Consent Order application.

Data protection

On 25 May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) became law. The law requires Highways England to explain to you – consultees, stakeholders and customers – how your personal data will be used and stored.

Highways England adheres to the Government's consultation principles, the Planning Act 2008 and the Highways Act 1980 as required and may collect personal data to help shape development of highways schemes.

Personal data collected by the project team will be processed and retained by Highways England and its appointed contractors until the scheme is complete.

Under the GDPR regulations you have the following rights:

- right of access to the data (Subject Access Request)
- right for the rectification of errors
- right to erasure of personal data this is not an absolute right under the legislation
- right to restrict procession or to object to processing
- right to data portability

If, at any point, Highways England plans to process the personal data we hold for a purpose other than for which it was originally collected, we will tell you what that other purpose is. We will do this prior to any further processing taking place and we will include any relevant additional information, including your right to object to that further processing.

You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, the Information Commissioners Office.

The proposed scheme

The scheme design

The proposed improvements to the corridor are outlined within the consultation brochure or at https://highwaysengland.co.uk/projects/a47-wansford-to-sutton-dualling/.


The scheme includes the upgrade of 1.6 miles of existing A47 single carriageway between the A1 and existing roundabout at Nene Way to dual carriageway.

The scheme will be constructed to the north of the existing A47 from the A1 for approximately 800m, before crossing south, where it will be constructed to this side of the existing A47 until it ties into the existing dual carriageway at the Nene Way Roundabout.

The scheme includes a new free-flow slip road which will connect the existing A1 southbound carriageway to the new A47 eastbound carriageway. The existing slip road from the A1 southbound will be retained for all other movements.

The scheme also includes improvements to the existing roundabouts at the A1/A47 junction and the existing Nene Way Roundabout to the eastern end of the scheme. The side roads along the route and access to local businesses will also be altered to improve safety and reliability.

In addition, the scheme includes improved connectivity between Wansford, Sutton and local amenities for walking, cycling and horse riding.







Before we make our application for a Development Consent Order, we are gathering environmental information, identifying the potential impacts of the proposed scheme and developing measures to secure environmental benefits to avoid or reduce adverse effects. This process is called the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). While the EIA is ongoing, we have prepared a Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) to describe the environmental setting and currently anticipated effects of the proposed scheme. A Non-Technical Summary (NTS) of the PEIR has also been prepared to summarise the potential environmental effects. The findings of the PEIR and the NTS are also summarised within our consultation materials, including the consultation brochure and exhibition boards
